#### Artistic approach/julia Huteau

The volumes I create are forms and colours made up of ceramic materials.

I'm certainly most interested in learning, either in my work or in life in general. The complete aspect of ceramics is also fascinating to me, its history, artistic and scientific dimensions and I constantly go back and forth between these facets and subjects depending on my desires and needs.

My artistic universe is made up of questions, research and multiple selections and choices which end up shaping my work. I'm strongly influenced by numerous subjects I love such as physics, light, space.

Three series stand out. *De l'espace entre les couleurs* (Space between colours), a collection of investigations into colour and light inspired by Bauhaus theoretician, painter and teacher Johannes Itten. *Le Reste* (Leftover), an body of work focused on ecology, spontaneous gestures brought forth by our collective reality. Lastly, the *Opus* collection, in which forms and colours are paralleled with considerations about scale and balance. No more back and forth between drawing and volume as I have mostly done previously - instead, convergence between the preparatory drawing, raw model and final form.

Today, the spatial installation of the shapes I create has become essential. I don't necessarily work to make self-sufficing objects but towards considering the empty space around and animating them, from pure object to a form in a given space.

I deeply wish to carry on learning and discovering new dimensions of Art






